## IDPs from Mare' Sub-district

31 August 2015

People in Mare' sub-district and the villages of Sandaf, Harbel, and Sheikh Issa have moved out after ISIL advanced in Mare' and took over Sandaf and Harbel villages.

Latest figures on Mare' show that there were 35,000 people, 26,500 were native inhabitants of the village, and 8,500 are IDPs mostly from Aleppo City and the eastern countryside of Aleppo.

A large population of Mare' residents moved out to Aleppo Province's sub-districts where they settled in their villages and cities, while others headed to camps in Aleppo countryside.

### IDPs were distributed as follows:

Tal Raf'at and the neighboring farm lands 5,000 IDPs

I'zaz, its villages, and border camps 8,000 IDPs

Haretan and its villages 8,000 IDPs

Western Countryside 8,000 IDPs

Eastern Countryside (Al-Bab and its villages) 5,000 IDPs

Only about 1,000 people stayed in Mare'

### IDPs that headed to Aleppo Countryside camps:

A large number of IDPs reached camps in Aleppo countryside. Some camps executed a quick response to the large displacement wave within the present resources from organizations supervising these camps, while other camps failed to respond to this large displacement wave. IDPs are still waiting for an immediate response to ensure their basic needs like shelter and food items. The table below shows IDPs' distribution and basic needs.

### IDPs that headed to Aleppo Sub-districts

#### 1. Haretan Sub-district:

The massive shelling did not refrain a number of Mare' IDPs from coming to Haretan and its villages, as they are relatively close to Mare', and they contain a number of empty buildings that used to be government official properties. Part of the IDPs settled in host families' houses, making it hard to determine their exact needs. ACU's enumerators reached the IDPs mass shelters and recorded their stats accurately.

Only few IDPs reached Aleppo City, as the shelling on the city is non-stop, in addition to people's fear of a closing siege by the regime and ISIL together.

### 3. I'zaz Sub-district:

**1,300** families have reached I'zaz sub-district, and numbers are still on the rise due to the area's close position to the Turkish borders. IDPs were preliminarily distributed on mass shelters, with efforts exerted to ensure their basic needs, and those who are still homeless outdoors.

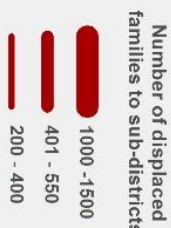

There is an urgent need for baby milk in all areas, which should be distributed via medical centers in displacement gatherings.
