## SYRIAN CRISIS

### Forced Displacement from the Eastern Ghota Rural Damascus Governorate

#### Overview:

After the agreements brokered by Russia with Ahrar al-Sham and Faylaq al-Rahman to transfer civilians and AOGs fighters to Idleb Governorate, the Information Management Unit (IMU) of the Assistance Coordination Unit (ACU), through its network of field enumerators, worked on tracking the cross-line displacement from Eastern Ghota in Rural Damascus in the locations where they settled in north-western Syria after they passed zero point at Madiq Castle in As- Suqaylabiyah District in Hama Governorate and decided not to stay in the NGO-run reception centers. IMU enumerators collected the data, and 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report *“Forced Displacement from the Eastern Ghota”*<sup>1</sup> was issued, covering the period between 14 and 28 March. However, due to the fact that the forced displacement was continuous from Arbin, Ein Terma, Zamalka along with Jober neighborhood in Eastern Ghota, the negotiations were ongoing with Jaysh al-Islam in to evacuate the population of Duma in Rural Damascus – the last stronghold of AOGs in Eastern Ghota – and that some communities were not covered in the 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report, IMU enumerators kept tracking the movements of the IDPs in their large concentrations in north-western Syria. The 2<sup>nd</sup> version of *“Forced Displacement from the Eastern Ghota”* included follow-up and updated information of the period between 29 March and 10 April.

In 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report, it was mentioned that more than 30,000 people displaced from Eastern Ghota in Rural Damascus and passed zero point at Madiq Castle, where IMU enumerators were able to track only 20,490 ones at their current destinations in north-western Syria. In this report, IMU enumerators managed to track additional 26,469 people displaced to north-western Syria, Afrin and Euphrates Shield area to reach a total of 46,959 IDPs at their current destinations in comparison with 55,817 ones reported by OCHA in their 2<sup>nd</sup> situation report *“Situation in North-western Syria”*<sup>2</sup> who have already passed zero point at Madiq Castle. Meanwhile, CCCM issued a Flash Update *“Displacements from eastern Ghouta as of 10 April 2018”*, highlighting that 55,410-displaced people were reported to arrive at zero point in Madiq Castle between 13 march and 10 April; 8,792 of them are reported arrivals in CCCM Reception Centers.

#### Methodology:

Face to face interviews were conducted with Key Informants (KIs) to collect the data including community leaders, Local Council members, Civil Society members, NGOs or members of registration points of both IDPs and host community. 40 enumerators were tasked by IMU to interview one sample at each community using Excel Form. Then, the data was analyzed to generate the figures and the maps were produced to be included in the report. Meanwhile, CCCM and OCHA reports were used as secondary data for triangulation.

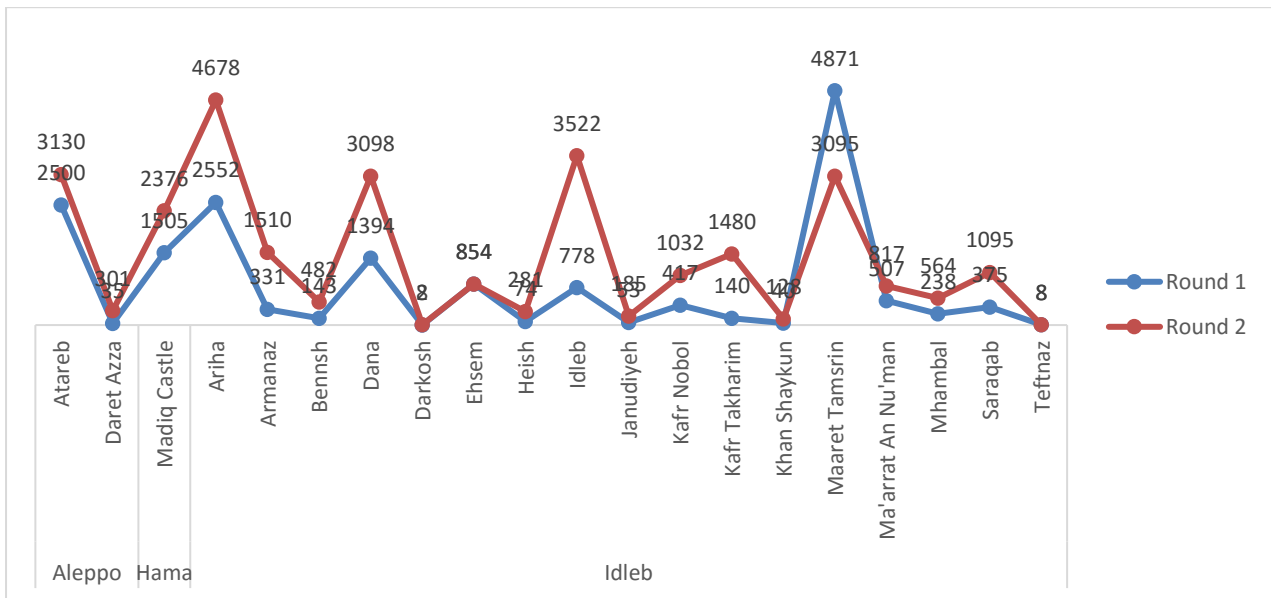
**Duma Under Chemical Attack:**

On 7 April 2018, the population hid in the basements of Duma started their day normally with warplanes dropping bombs and ambulances rescuing the injured. Yet, they were determined not to leave Duma. The next few hours were enough to change their minds with reports of cases of gasping, trembling people, with foaming at the mouth, started arriving at one of the few functioning clinics. The symptoms were unlike those displayed when Chlorine was used. In short, Duma was under “Chemical Attack”, resulting in 43 victims including 12 children and 15 women along with 185 casualties including 56 children and 44 women as per Syrian Civil Defense. Consequently, on 8 April, an agreement was reached to evacuate the populations in Duma city to Northern Aleppo countryside.

**Demographics of IDPs:**

73 communities in 20 sub-districts in Idleb governorate, Western Aleppo countryside and Northern Hama countryside were covered by IMU enumerators in 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report. IMU enumerators revisited these communities and found out that 7 communities were empty of IDPs while the number of IDPs in the remaining 66 communities was increased by 41%, reaching 28,644 IDPs (round 2) in comparison with 16,817 IDPs (round 1) in 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report. The increase in the number of the IDPs was reported in 19 sub-districts, unlike Maaret Tamsrin sub-district where the number was decreased by 1,776 IDPs and that might be attributed to the lack of services.

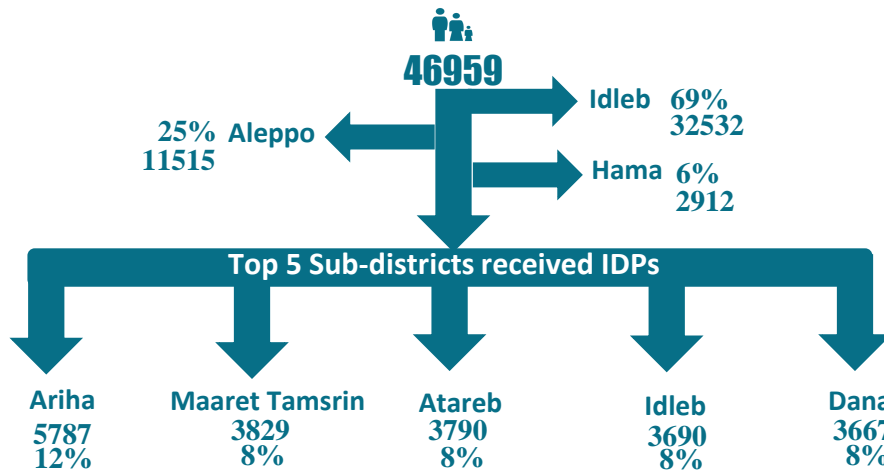
*Figure 1: Comparison between the revisited communities in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> issues of this report.*



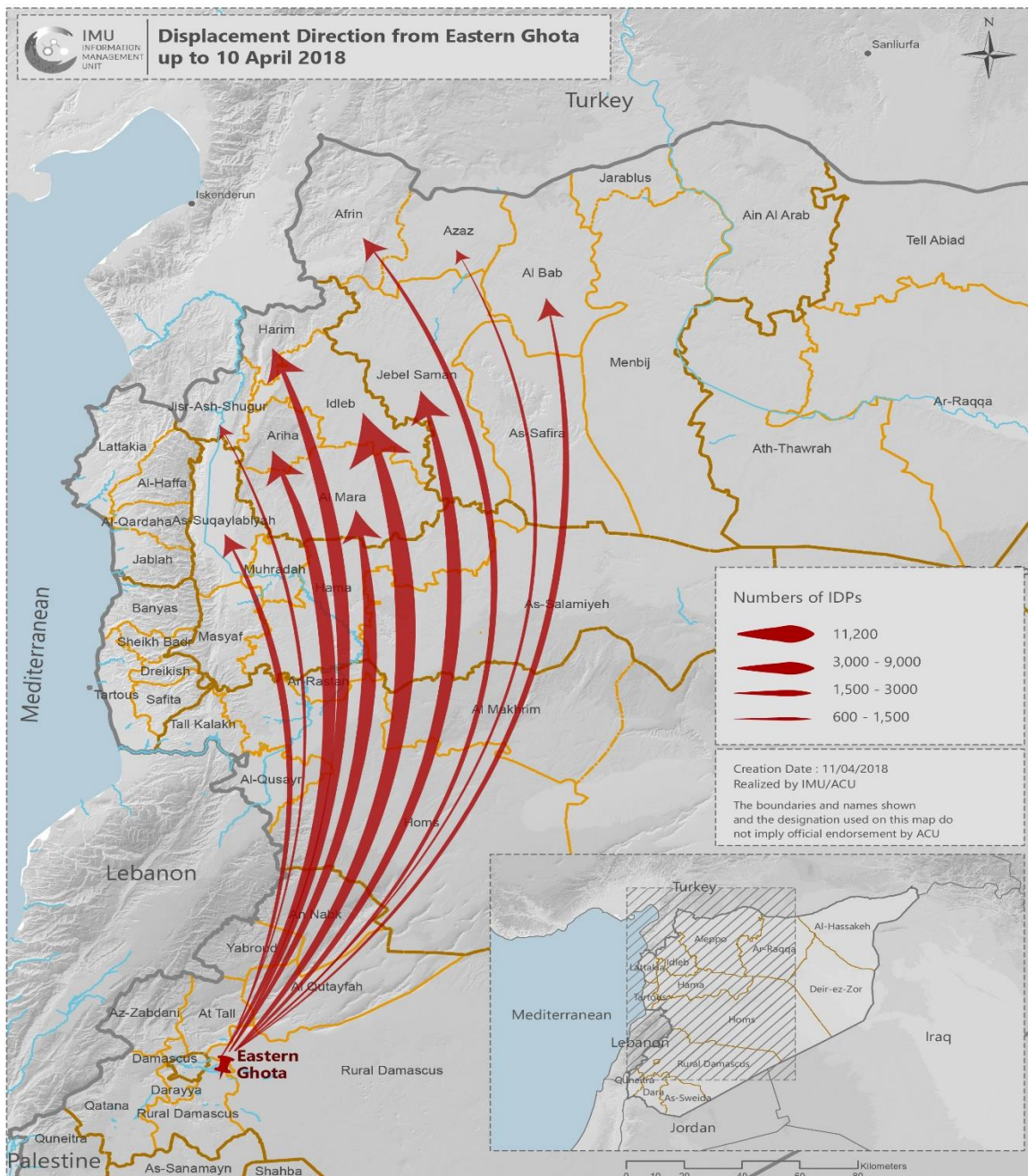
In total, IMU enumerators tracked the IDPs in 162 communities in 31 sub-districts. Up to 10 April 2018, 46,959 IDPs were reported by the enumerators of IMU to arrive at their current destinations in 3 governorates – Idleb by 69% (32,532 IDPs), Aleppo by 25% (11,515 IDPs) and Hama by 6% (2,912 IDPs). The top 5 sub-districts receiving IDPs were Ariha sub-district by 12% (5,787 IDPs), Maaret Tamsrin sub-district by 8% (3,829 IDPs), Atareb sub-district by 8% (3,790 IDPs), Idleb sub-district by 8% (3,690 IDPs) and Dana sub-district by 8% (3,667 IDPs) of the total number of IDPs.



Figure 2: IDPs segregated by locations

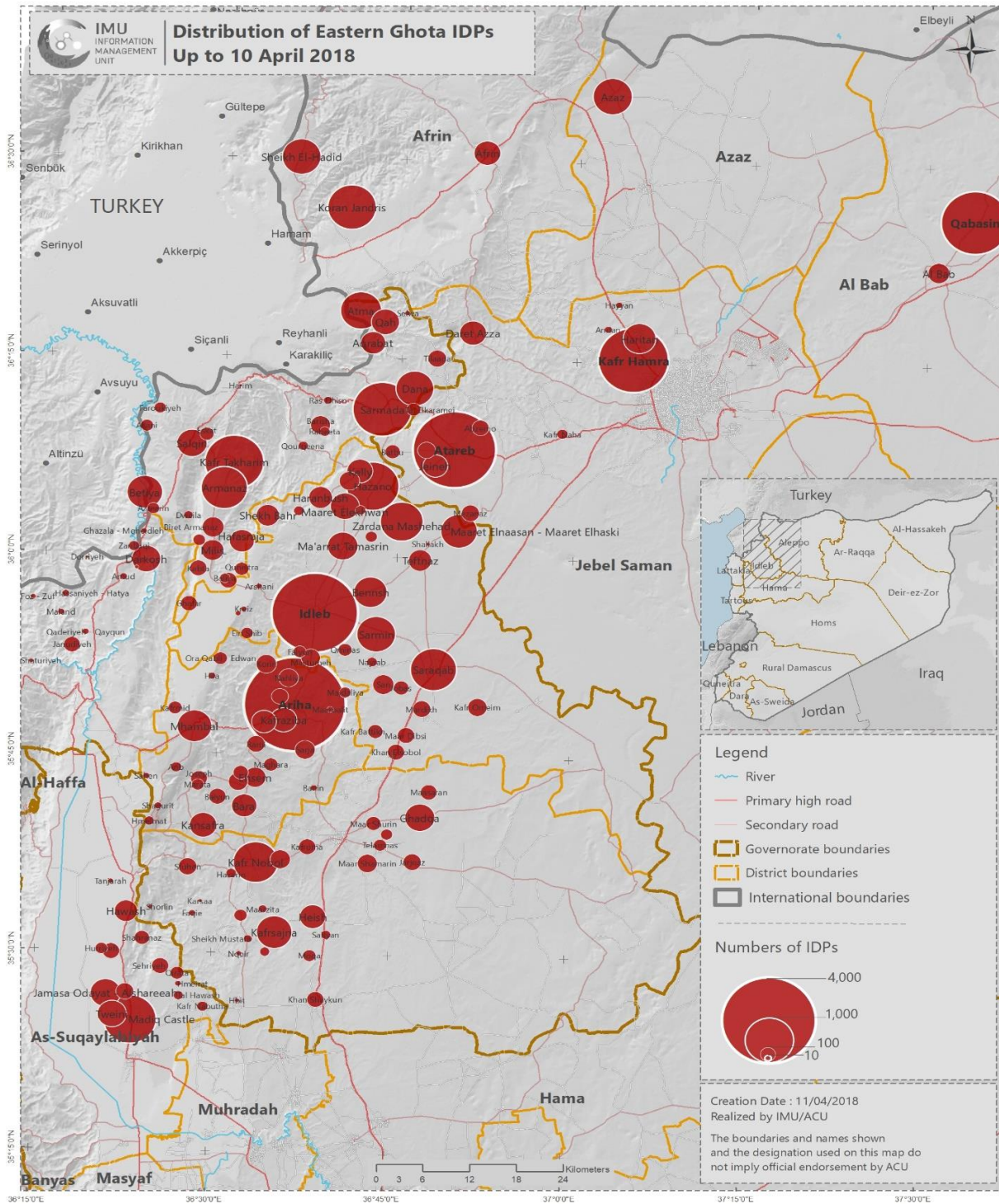


Map1: Forced Displacement Directions from Eastern Ghota



The first convoys reported in 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report headed to Idleb, Northern Hama countryside and Western Aleppo countryside. New locations were added to the list of the destinations IDPs from Eastern Ghota are heading to including A`zaz and Al Bab in Northern Aleppo countryside along with Afrin District which are expected to receive more IDPs in the coming days/weeks.

**Map 2: IDPs Distribution Locations**



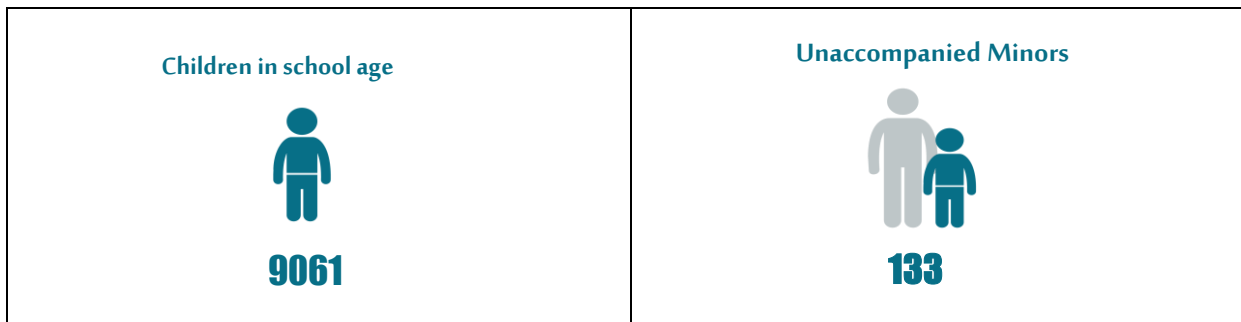


**IDPs segregated by gender and special cases:**

47% (22,036 IDPs) of the total number of IDPs tracked by IMU enumerators are males in comparison with 53% (24,923 IDPs) are females including 3,551 infants who suffered from malnutrition because of the siege and, meanwhile, there were reports stating that this category is not fully mapped by the other agencies providing emergency response. The convoys also included 9,061 children at school age, 133 unaccompanied minors and 634 injured who need immediate medical interventions.

**Figure 3: Categories of IDPs.**

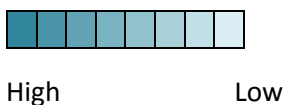




The majority of the families arrived was whole families (husband, wife and children). Meanwhile, single men and female-headed families were also frequently noticed types of the IDPs.

Figure 4: Classification of IDPs.

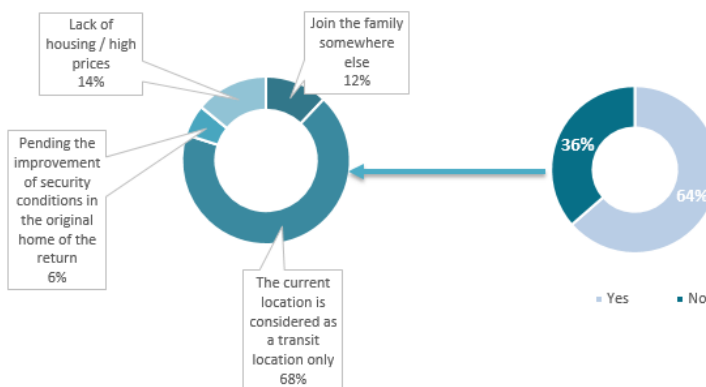

**IDPs future:**

IMU enumerators found out that 64% of the IDPs have no intentions to leave their current locations in comparison with 36% who showed willingness to be re-displaced because some of them consider their current locations as transit by 68%, the lack of housing and high prices force 14% of them to think of being re-displaced, 12% of them wish to be re-unified with their families and 6% waiting for the security situation to improve to return.

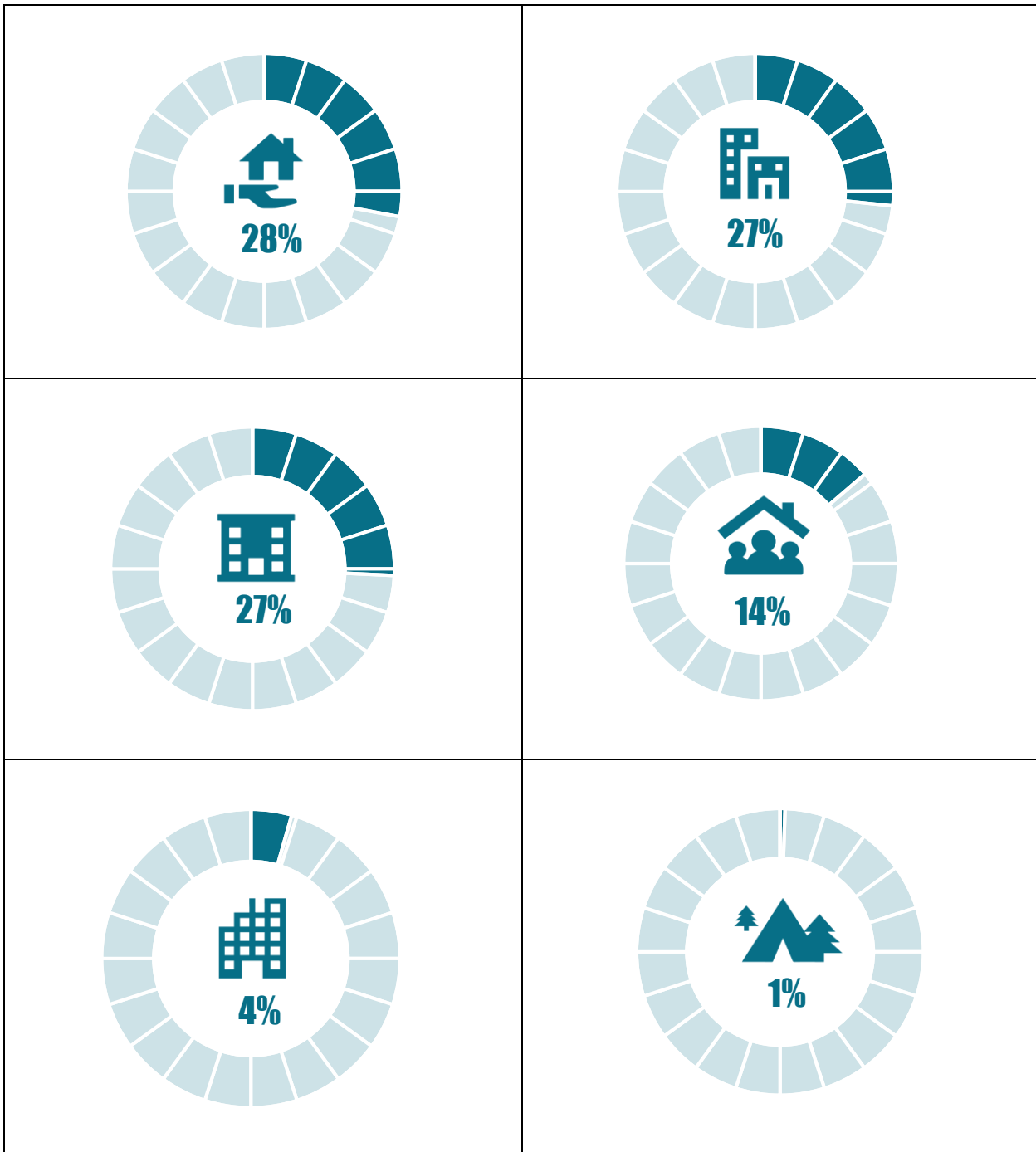
Figure 5: IDPs` intentions to stay in their current locations



**Shelters of IDPs:**

28% of the IDPs settled in right-to-use houses, 27% settled in rented houses and flats, 27% are in collective centers, 14% are hosted by other families, 4% are settled in empty or incomplete buildings and 1% found shelter in informal settlements or open spaces.

**Priorities of the IDPs in terms of needs:**

Cash assistance came first on the list of priorities of the IDPs, followed by food baskets and the distribution of blankets & mattresses along with house items.

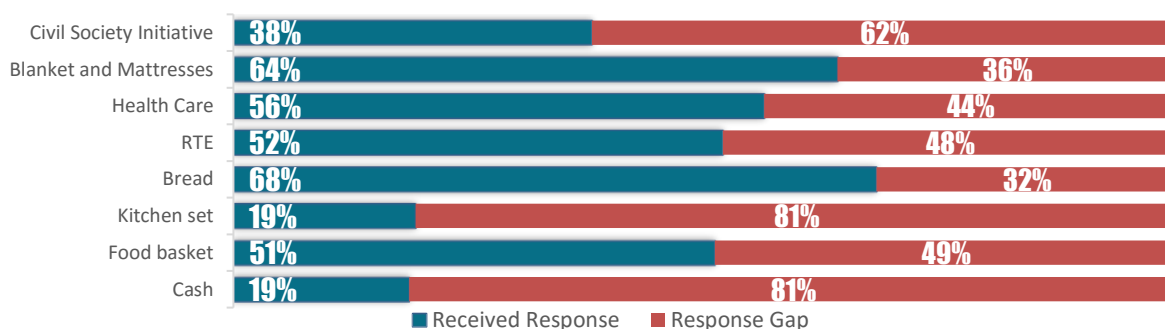


**Response Analysis:**

Out of 46,959 IDPs, only 68% were supported by bread. 64% were supported by blankets and mattresses where it is recommended to distribute them together as IMU enumerators reported that some active agencies have distributed them separately and that would be useless. 56% received health care, but patients with chronic diseases and injuries are in need of additional health care and should be targeted with periodic medications. 52% were supported by Ready To Eat rations (RTEs). 51% were supported by food baskets. 19% received kitchen kits, and only 19% of the total number were supported by cash grants which is still considered the most urgent and needed gap to be filled because these grants would save the IDPs dignity to meet their needs mainly shelter and that would mitigate the multi-displacement they are undergoing.

In comparison with 1<sup>st</sup> issue of this report, it is obvious that the capacity of the active agencies to respond started to decrease because it was expected that more displaced people would arrive. So, it was reported that 38% of the different needs of the displaced populations were covered by civil society initiatives. Furthermore, most of the Local Councils visited by IMU enumerators reported the lack of resources to cover the needs of the increased numbers of IDPs. Simultaneously, there were some reports highlighting that active agencies focused their response at zero point only.

**Recommendations:**

More displacement to northern Syria is expected as 78,000 – 150,000 individuals are estimated to be under siege in Duma City as per OCHA. The active agencies and the Civil Society initiatives were only able to cover 46% of the needs on average. More resources need to be secured to cover the increased needs of the displaced people, taking into consideration that the agencies responding currently were reported to run out of prepositioned resources, forcing Civil Society initiatives to be activated to cover 38% of the needs up to the period of writing this report.

It is recommended to increase the level of coordination between active agencies to avoid the concentration of the response at zero point.

Targeting the newly displaced people from Eastern Ghota must be dealt with carefully in order not to create any kind of tension between the new arrivals and the old IDPs who might start feeling ignored. That can be mitigated by raising the awareness of the IDPs through awareness sessions and the distribution of brochures highlighting the suffering the new arrivals went through under siege.

The reported convoys included 9,061 children at school age. Therefore, long-term plans should be made in order to integrate them into schools as soon as possible because 64% of the newly arrived IDPs stated that they have no intentions to leave their current locations.

ACU reiterate calling the international community and all working organizations to search for a strategic solution to secure a permanent shelter for the Eastern Ghota displaced, in addition to providing the suitable health care, psychological support, and supporting them with urgent cash grants to acquire the basic needs for the displaced households.
