



2,940 violations of truce


committed by the Regime and its Russian ally

After the Turkey and Russia reached a **ceasefire agreement** in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the **regime continued to bomb** these cities and towns **with heavy artillery and rockets** from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, **Russian warplanes resumed bombing** cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, **ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire**. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire **2,940 times**.



After the ceasefire came into effect, **Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols** on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, **Russian forces stopped participating in these patrols** in mid-September 2020.






Result of the hostilities of the regime and its allies in northwest Syria

Result of the hostilities of the Regime and its allies in northwest Syria


In northwest Syria camps 19 accidents led to the burning of 27 tents and the injury of 4 IDPs.

In northwest Syria 2 IEDs exploded, injuring 3.

In the central region of Idlib governorate, on January 1, 2022, the Russian warplanes bombed the outskirts of Idlib city and Kansafra town with several airstrikes. In the western countryside of Idlib, Russian warplanes bombed Jisr Al-Shughur city and Jdeidet Al-Jisr and Bikfla towns with several airstrikes, killing two children and a woman, injuring 10 civilians, including 6 children in Bikfla town, and killing a girl in Jisr al-Shughur city. It is noteworthy that Russian warplanes targeted the towns during the first hour of 2022. On January 2, 2022, the Russian warplanes bombed the main water station in Idlib city with several airstrikes, which resulted in the injury of one of the workers and the complete destruction of the station, hence going out of service. It is noteworthy that the station is supported by GOAL NGO and supplies water to a large number of cities and towns. On January 3, 2022, Russian warplanes bombed Kafr Takharim city with several airstrikes, killing a civilian and injuring 5, including 3 children.

The administration of the National Hospital in Idlib governorate announced the suspension of the emergency and ambulance department, due to the suspension of funding, the lack of fuel, and the lack of oxygen, medicines, and consumables. It is worth noting that the emergency department was receiving more than 500 patients daily. Hospital officials confirm that funding for the hospital has stopped and that this hospital serves more than 30,000 patients per month.

Northeast Syria



In the eastern countryside of Deir ez-Zor, on January 5, 2022, regime-loyal Iranian militias bombed with artillery shells the base of the international coalition in the al-Omar oil field east of Theban city. The coalition forces responded by bombing Iranian militia sites in the vicinity of al-Mayadin city. On January 7, 2022, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF), with the support of the international coalition warplanes, conducted an arrest campaign in al-Busaira city.

In the northern countryside of al-Hasaka, on January 1, 2022, a child died in al-Hol camp as a result of the extreme cold and lack of healthcare. On January 3, 2022, US forces moved out a military convoy from al-Waleed crossing into northern Iraq. The convoy consists of 128 vehicles, including 60 closed freight trucks and oil tanks, and 60 tank transporters carrying tanks and various military equipment, some of which are covered with tarps. The convoy was accompanied by 8 armored vehicles. On January 4, 2022, a young man set himself on fire in al-Nashwa al-Gharbia neighborhood in al-Hasakah city. The 30-year-old man set himself on fire due to the poor living conditions. On January 5, 2022, SDF kidnapped a 16-year-old girl in al-Qamishli city to be recruited into mandatory conscription. The kidnapped girl suffers from neurological and psychological diseases, atrophy, and poor growth.

In northeast Syria, the Kurdish National Council issued a statement condemning the ongoing violations against it by the SDF and its affiliated militias. The statement called on the United States to intervene to put an end to these violations, as a PYD-affiliated group fired live bullets at the doors of the council in ad-Darbasiyah city on New Year's Eve. In addition, members of the Kurdish National Council were kidnapped, tortured, and threatened with death at the hands of SDF-loyal militias. The SDF-affiliated Autonomous Administration refused to return more than 500 teachers to their work after their dismissal due to their failure to enroll in the so-called "self-defense duty," as SDF changed the recruitment decision and it no longer included these dismissed teachers. However, the Autonomous Administration refused to reinstate them.
