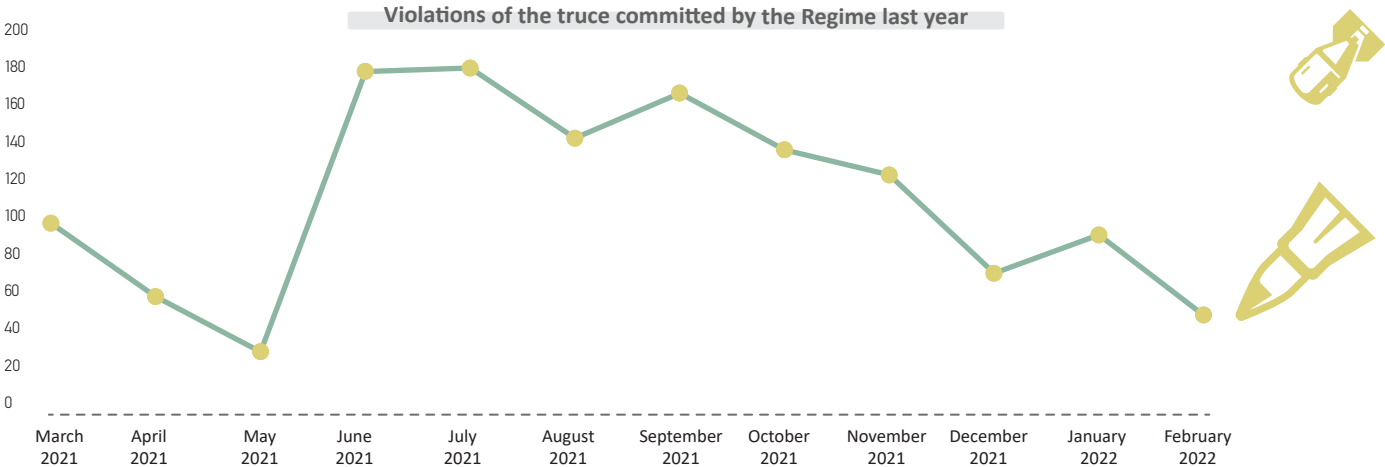

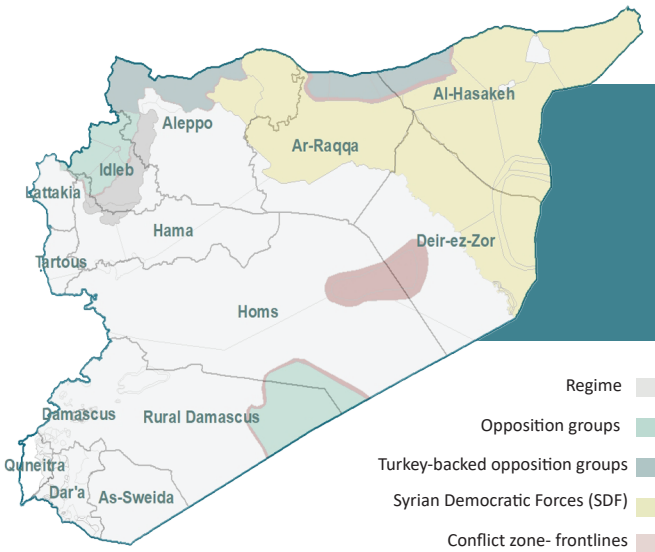
3,053 violations of truce committed by the Regime and its Russian ally

After the Turkey and Russia reached a ceasefire agreement in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the regime continued to bomb these cities and towns with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, Russian warplanes resumed bombing cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire 3,053 times.



After the ceasefire came into effect, Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, Russian forces stopped participating in these patrols in mid-September 2020.

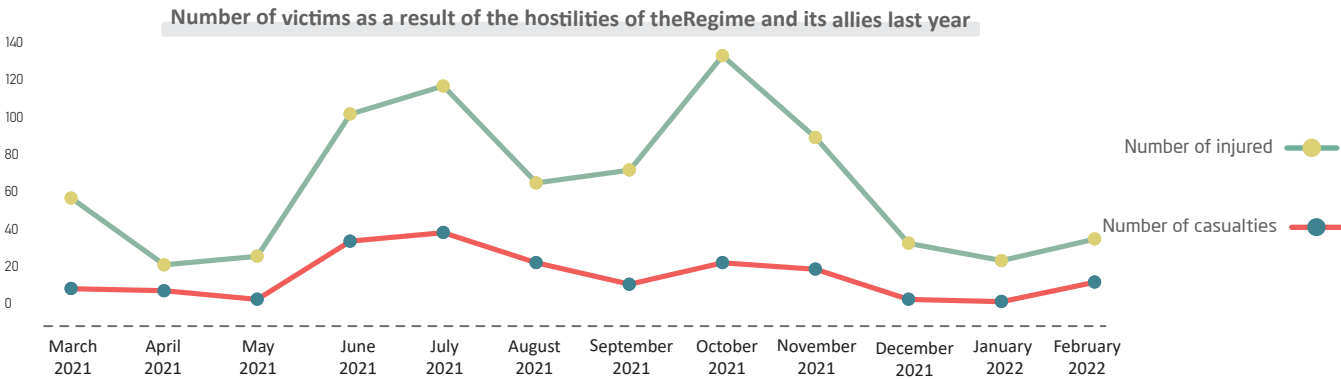
Controlling Parties 15 March 2022



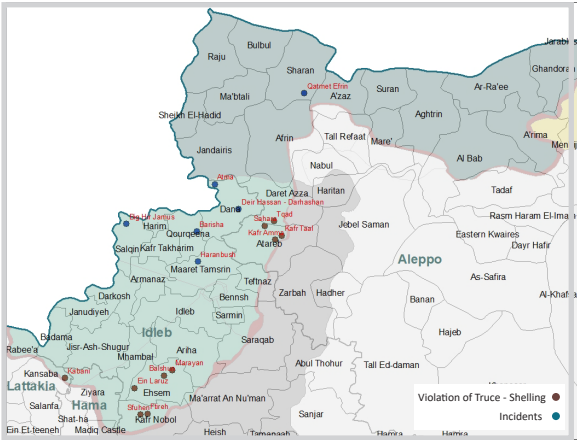
Since the beginning of the truce and until this date

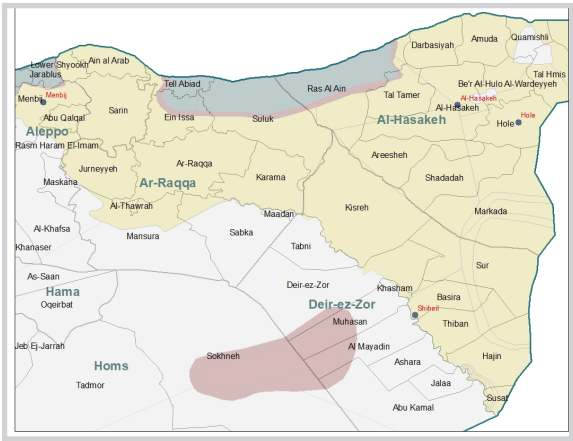


Result of the hostilities of the Regime and its allies in northwest Syria

In northwestern Syria camps
8 incidents led to the burning of 8 tents and the injury of 5 displaced people, and 1,268 tents were damaged as a result of rainstorms and severe winds.

In the central area of Idlib Governorate, on 11 March 2022, the Awqaf (Endowment) Building in Binnish city collapsed due to heavy rain, and it is reported that the building was shelled by a concussion missile by Russian warplanes on 25 February 2017. In northwestern Syria, heavy rainstorms and winds occurred between 2 and 13 March 2022, partially damaging 791 tents, completely destroying 477 tents, and destroying shelter items in the damaged tents.

Northeast Syria



In the eastern countryside of Deir ez-Zor, on 9 March 2022, regime forces rocketed Shuhayl town from ground launchers and targeted two civilian houses, destroying them without causing any casualties.

In al-Hasakah governorate, on 10 March 2022, four children and a jeweler were abducted for ransom by unknown persons in al-Hasakah city within one week. The kidnappers demand large sums of money for the release of the abducted. One of the kidnappings affected the son of a merchant in al-Hasakah city, and his kidnappers demanded \$60,000 in exchange for his release. A gold jeweler was also kidnapped at night from his home in the Tel Hajar neighborhood, which is considered a relatively safe neighborhood in al-Hasakah city, but the demanded ransom was greater, as the kidnappers demanded \$100,000 in exchange for his release. Haidar al-Hassoun, a child residing in al-Gweiran neighborhood in al-Hasakah city, was abducted and freed for \$10,000, in addition to the child Saleh Taha al-Sufi as well as another child. Kidnapping for ransom has recently increased dramatically in Syria, due to poverty and the economic crises that are ravaging the country. On 11 March 2022, a fire broke out in the immigrant women's section of al-Hol Camp, killing one woman and injuring three others.

In the eastern countryside of Aleppo, on 11 March 2022, a 5-year-old girl was strangled by one of her parents in Manbij city, and SDF police arrested the girl's parents, each accusing the other of committing the crime.
