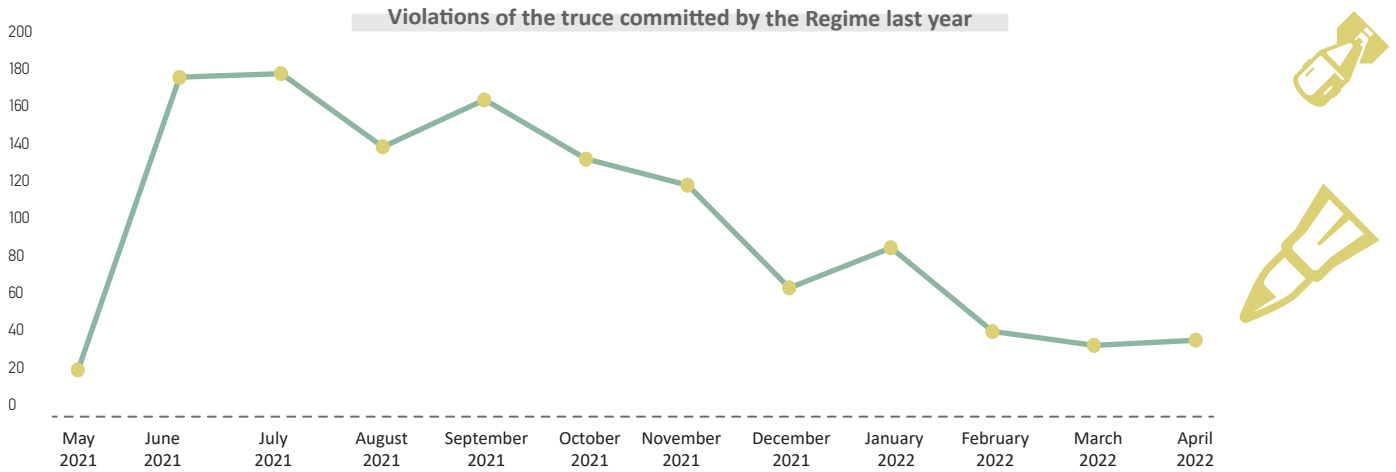

NORTHEAST AND NORTHWEST 1-7 June; 2022

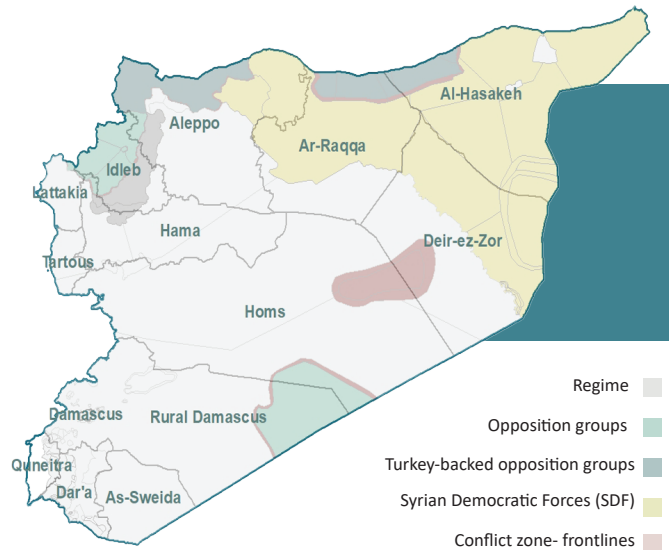
3,176 violations of truce committed by the Regime and its Russian ally

After the Turkey and Russia reached a **ceasefire agreement** in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the **regime continued to bomb** these cities and towns **with heavy artillery and rockets** from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, **Russian warplanes resumed bombing** cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, **ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire**. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire **3,176 times**.



After the ceasefire came into effect, **Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols** on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, **Russian forces stopped participating in these patrols** in mid-September 2020.

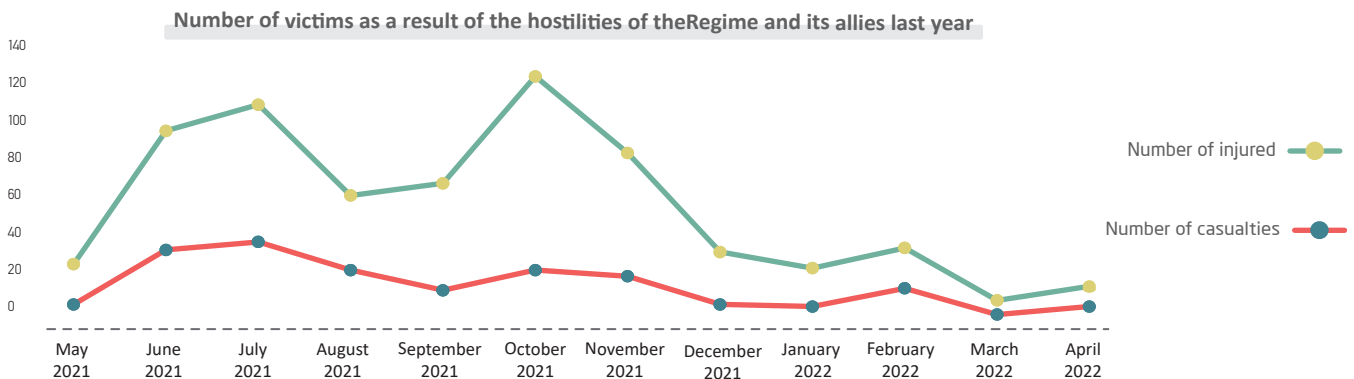
Controlling Parties 7 June 2022



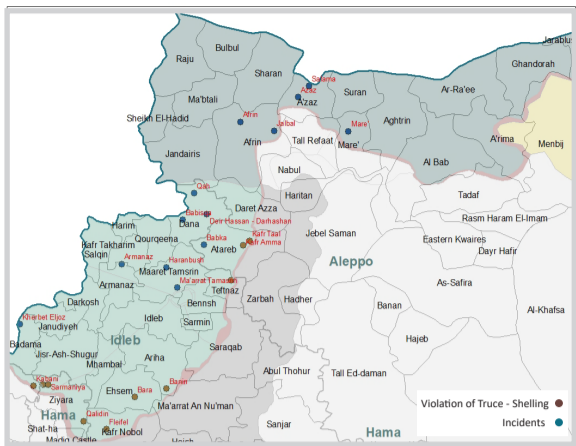

Result of the hostilities of the Regime and its allies in northwest Syria

In northwest Syria: 3 IEDs detonated, killing 2 civilians, and injuring 7 others.

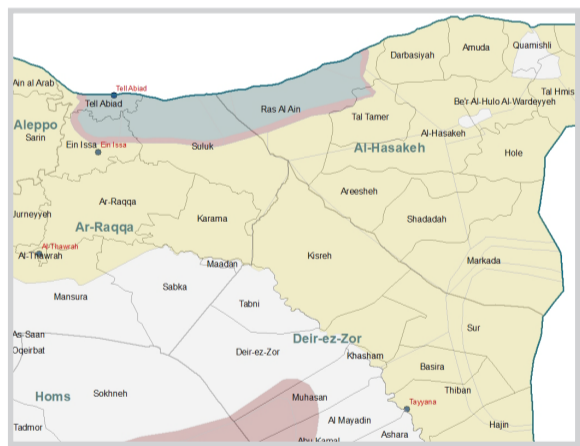
In northwest Syria camps: 11 accidents led to the burning of 21 tents, damaging 559 others, killing 3 displaced persons, and injuring 6 others.

On 1 June 2022, in the northern countryside of Aleppo, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) targeted Jalabul village in the countryside of Afrin with heavy artillery. SDF targeted a civilian vehicle in al-Helwanji town with a guided missile, injuring 4 civilians, including 2 children who were inside the vehicle. In the northern countryside of Idlib, an arms depot exploded near Babska town, damaging 17 camps as a result of falling shrapnel. Massive fires erupted, affecting more than 19 tents, killing 3 displaced persons, including a woman with disability, and injuring a displaced person, where 154 tents were completely destroyed, and 405 others were damaged. More than 3,500 IDPs fled their camps for fear of shrapnel. The regime's Ministry of Local Administration and Environment announced an auction to invest in pistachio trees in the farms of the southern countryside of Idlib, and through the announcement, the lands of the displaced will be auctioned off for investment.

On 3 June 2022, the northern countryside of Aleppo witnessed civil demonstrations in protest against the increase in the price of kilowatts of electricity and the rationing policy of the electricity companies STE and AK Energy. The protesters stormed the building of electricity in both Mari' and Afrin cities, and the protesters burned the buildings until the opposition's civilian police intervened and fired live bullets to disperse the demonstrators. Shooting live bullets led to the killing of a demonstrator and injuring another, and a body of a civilian was found charred as a result of the fires set by the demonstrators to the electricity building in Afrin city.

6 June 2022, in the western countryside of Aleppo, a 50-year-old man committed suicide by shooting himself in Abyan town in the Atareb sub-district. In the western countryside of Idlib, a woman in her twenties, who is a mother of 3 children, committed suicide by taking poisonous pills. In the northern countryside of Aleppo, a young man in Azaz city committed suicide by throwing himself out of a building.

Northeast Syria



In the northern countryside of al-Hasakah, on 4 June 2022, a new group of Iraqi families living in al-Hol camp drove through a convoy of vehicles accompanied by a security escort from the camp to Iraqi territory. The convoy included the 125 Iraqi families wishing to return to their homes, including some 600 persons carrying Iraqi IDs, including women, children, and men. On 6 June 2022, a young man in al-Hasakah city committed suicide by hanging himself, and the young man was a medical student. The majority of the rainfed agricultural lands cultivated with lentil did not reach the harvesting stage this year, due to severe drought and poor rainfall. Information confirms that only 5.5% of the areas cultivated with lentil in the entire land of al-Hasakeh have been harvested for a week, and that 31,000 rainfed hectares that are cultivated with lentil are completely out of production due to drought, and the areas of irrigated lands cultivated with lentil which remain valid for harvest did not exceed 1,800 hectares in all rural areas of al-Hasakeh governorate.

In the northern countryside of ar-Raqqa, on 1 June 2022, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) shelled Tal Abyad city, killing 4 civilians and injuring 20 others. On 4 June 2022, huge military reinforcements of Russian troops arrived at al-Thawra Airport (Al-Tabqah). On 6 June 2022, the regime forces dispatched military reinforcements to Ain Issa city.
