



After the Turkey and Russia reached a ceasefire agreement in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the regime continued to bomb these cities and towns with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, Russian warplanes resumed bombing cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire 3.227 times.




After the ceasefire came into effect, Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, Russian forces stopped participating in

In the northern countryside of Aleppo, on 25 June 2022, a 15-year-old boy committed suicide in Afrin city by taking a poisonous pill. On 27 June 2022, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) bombed al-Baldiq town in the countryside of Jarablus sub-district with heavy artillery, killing a civilian and wounding a woman. SDF also shelled Arab Hussein town in al-Ghandoura sub-district with heavy artillery. Two car bombs exploded in the towns of Tall Ali and Thalja in al-Ghandoura sub-district withnout causing any casualties. A car bomb exploded in Shuwayha town, near Qabbasin town, with no casualties.

In northwest Syria, severe windstorms occurred between 20-25 June 2022, resulting in the total destruction of 19 tents and the partial destruction of 10 tents without casualties.

In the northern countryside of al-Hasakah, on 25 June 2022, the International Coalition forces carried out an airdrop operation in the Aziziyah neighborhood in al-Hasakah city, during which they arrested a person from his home, one of the notables of the Sharabin tribe. The operation was carried out with the support of the so-called rapid intervention forces (Hat) (SWAT) of the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF). The detainee's eyes were blindfolded, and he was transported by helicopter to an unknown destination. During the operation, the detainee's two sons were injured after the coalition forces unleashed three trained dogs inside the house. The coalition forces also confiscated 2 kg of gold from the detainee's house, in addition to money that was in the house. Five people were killed by fighting between cousins in Ghuzaylah village, in al-Qahtaniyah sub-district, north of al-Hasakah, which is under the control of SDF. There was a disagreement over a plot of land between them and it developed into an exchange of fire that resulted in five deaths and 11 injuries. Because of SDF's failure to intervene to solve the problem, the people of the area appealed to the sheikhs and notables of the Arab tribes to intervene to stop the bloodshed. Eight people were killed last April, and more than 20 others were injured as a result of clan fighting in the northern countryside of al-Hasakah between two families of the Bani Sab'a clan, who live in Abu Dhwail village south of al-Qamishli city. Members of both families used machine guns in the fighting, and burned many houses in the villages of Abu Dhwail and Asfouria, which are located in the regime-controlled areas in al-Hasakah Governorate, amid the calls of the people for the intervention of other clans to resolve the dispute and stop the fighting. This is not the first incident. Last November, five civilians were killed and others injured in al-Amo village in the countryside of al-Shaddadi, south of al-Hasakah, which is controlled by the SDF, due to clan fighting. The reason for the fighting was old revenge by two young men during their fight, which developed into the use of weapons and hand grenades between the two sides. On 28 June 2022, a young man in Tel Brak town in the Bir al-Helou al-Wardiyya sub-district committed suicide by blowing himself up with a hand grenade.

Northeast Syria



In al-Hol camp in the northern countryside of al-Hasakah, on 23 June 2022, a woman was found murdered in a football stadium, and the victim was displaced from al-Quriyah town in Deir ez-Zor governorate. On 24 June 2022, a Syrian displaced woman was shot in the head by unknown persons in the sixth sector of the camp. The victim was displaced from Aleppo governorate and was taken to a hospital in al-Hasakah for treatment. The Asayish forces of the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) besieged the foreign women's sector in the camp for more than three days, preventing the entry of vegetable and ice vehicles to the sector. The Asayish justified the siege by riots in the sector as a

result of the Asayish arresting a Russian refugee residing in the camp. On 25 June 2022, a woman was found murdered by beheading in the fifth sector of the camp, which is designated for Syrians. On 29 June 2022, the body of a man who had been shot dead was found in Sector 6 of al-Hol camp, reportedly designated for displaced Syrians.
