




FIELD DEVELOPMENTS

NORTHEAST AND NORTHWEST 22-31 July; 2022

violations of truce committed by the Regime and its Russian ally

After the Turkey and Russia reached a ceasefire agreement in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the regime continued to bomb these cities and towns with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, Russian warplanes resumed bombing cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire 3.357 times.



After the ceasefire came into effect, Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, Russian forces stopped participating in these patrols in mid-September 2020.



Result of the hostilities of the Regime and its allies in northwest Syria

In the camps of northwest Syria 11 incidents led to the burning of 12 tents, and 33 tents were damaged.

In northwestern Syria eight IEDs detonated, killing one civilian and injuring another.

On 22 July 2022, regime forces shelled the town of Mozra in the central district of Idleb governorate with heavy artillery, injuring three civilians. The regime forces shelled the town of Afs with heavy machine guns, injuring one child and three women. The regime forces shelled the town of Ruweiha with heavy artillery. In the western countryside of Idlib, Russian warplanes bombed the town of Jdidet Eljisr with several raids. The shelling targeted a poultry farm inhabited by IDPs, killing seven civilians, including four children, and injuring twelve civilians, including eight children.

On 23 July 2022, a wall collapsed in Zoghra IDP camp in the northern countryside of Aleppo, killing a 6-year-old girl. On 24 July 2022, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) bombed Khaldiyet Afrin camp near the town of Khaldiyet Afrin in Afrin sub-district, killing two displaced persons, injuring four others, and completely destroying three tents and affecting 30 tents. A 14-year-old displaced girl committed suicide by taking a poisonous pill, and the girl lived in the camps of Idleb governorate.

On 25 July 2022, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) targeted the outskirts of the city of Azaz with rocket launchers, killing one woman and injuring three civilians. On 29 July 2022, a displaced woman in the Bardaqli camps committed suicide by taking a poisonous pill after a disagreement with her husband.

On 27 July 2022, a girl was killed. Her brother was shot by the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) in the city of Menbij in the eastern countryside of Aleppo, where SDF elements fired indiscriminately while chasing a wanted person, causing casualties. The Bu-Bana clan (from which the child victims fell) issued a statement demanding that SDF retaliate against its own elements who committed the crime.

On 27 July 2022, the regime forces shelled the city of Tafas in the western countryside of Daraa with mortar shells, killing one civilian and injuring three others. On 28 July 2022, the Karama Men's Movement (an armed group formed by the residents of the province of As Suwayda) seized machines and pressing machines for the manufacture of narcotic pills "Captagon" in the headquarters of Raji Falhut, who is supported by the security services of the Assad regime in the town of Atil north of As Suwayda. According to information sources, an armed group established in As-Sweida, with the support of the regime and Lebanese Hezbollah, established a factory to manufacture Captagon pills. The group promotes narcotics in Syria and smuggles them into Jordan.

Northeast Syria



On 22 July 2022, a clan fighting took place in the Tala'i neighborhood within the city of Al-Hasakeh, and weapons and bombs were used in the fighting, leading to the death of a civilian.

On 30 July 2022, the Russian forces conducted a military patrol in areas under US control in Al-Hasakeh governorate for the first time. Russian forces in Quamishli conducted a patrol with a depth of 30 KM, opposite the Syrian-Iraqi border to the city of Ya'robiyah through the Al-Walid and Semalka border crossings with the Kurdistan Region of Iraq. The patrol, consisting of several military vehicles, traveled between the cities of Rmeilan and Al-Malikeyyeh to the village of Kujarat and then to Ya'robiyah, where there is a US military base. A US patrol, accompanied by US military aircraft, then proceeded to the aforementioned areas (which the Russian patrol passed through) after the departure of the Russian patrol.
