



violations of truce committed by the Regime and its Russian ally

After the Turkey and Russia reached a ceasefire agreement in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the regime continued to bomb these cities and towns with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, Russian warplanes resumed bombing cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire 3.589 times.



After the ceasefire came into effect, Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, Russian forces stopped participating in these patrols in mid-September 2020.





In the camps of northwest Syria 4 incidents led to the burning of 12 tents and the injury of a civilian

In northwestern Syria

1 IED exploded, killing 1

On 3 September 2022, in the southern countryside of Idleb, regime forces shelled the town of Ftireh with heavy artillery, injuring a woman. In the central area of Idleb governorate, on 5 September 2022, regime forces shelled Bara with heavy artillery. An unknown explosive detonated in a house in Bennsh, killing four children. The explosion's causes were unclear whether a mine remnant of war caused it or whether it was an explosive device present in the house.



In the western countryside of Deir ez-Zor on 2 September 2022, the International Coalition conducted an airdrop operation on the village of Al-Taqihi, in the Basira sub-district, which led to the death of a former leader of the so-called ISIS, "Musaid Khalawi Al-Awira, nicknamed Abu Bakr Al-Taqihi," who held a leadership position in Al-Hisbah. The former leader fled when he heard the helicopter and was targeted by the uncrewed aerial vehicles of the Coalition in Al-Badia. On 3 September 2022, the International Coalition carried out an airdrop operation in cooperation with the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) in the town of Shiheil, which resulted in the arrest of a displaced person from the village of Muhasan, "nicknamed Abu Sirin."

In the northern countryside of Al-Hasakeh, on 5 September 2022, the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) discovered an ISIS prison in Hole camp, where they found three women bound with marks of torture. On 6 September 2022, for the first time and in the vicinity of the Syrian-Turkish-Iraqi border triangle, live-fire exercises and training were conducted for the Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) and the International Coalition Forces (ICF) in the villages of Kujarat. Tao missiles, RPG rounds, and Kalashnikov missiles were used in the exercises, with the presence of United States armored vehicles. This is the first time such exercises have occurred in this region.

In the eastern countryside of Damascus, on 4 September 2022, a delegation from the United States forces stationed at the At Tanf base visited the besieged Al-Rakban camp, which was the first time a commission from the United States forces had entered the camp.
