



NORTHEAST AND NORTHWEST 22-30 september; 2022

violations of truce committed by the Regime and its Russian ally

After the Turkey and Russia reached a ceasefire agreement in Idlib governorate on March 5, 2020, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally did not bomb northwest Syria with warplanes. However, the regime continued to bomb these cities and towns with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. On June 2, 2020, Russian warplanes resumed bombing cities and towns in northwest Syria, and the regime continued to bombard them with heavy artillery and rockets from ground launchers. Through its network of enumerators, ACU worked on documenting the regime's breach of the ceasefire. As of the date of preparing this report, the Syrian regime and its Russian ally have violated the ceasefire 3.734 times.



After the ceasefire came into effect, Turkish and Russian forces began conducting joint military patrols on the contact lines between the regime forces and the opposition forces, as these patrols run along the M4 international road. These joint forces aim to monitor the implementation of the ceasefire and de-escalation on the contact lines. However, Russian forces stopped participating in these patrols in mid-September 2020.





Result of the hostilities of the Regime and its allies in northwest Syria


In the camps of northwest Syria 7 incidents led to the burning of 8 tents and the injury of 1 IDP.

In northwestern Syria 1 IED exploded, injuring 3 civilians.

On 22 September 2022, in the western countryside of Aleppo, regime forces shelled the town of Daret Azza and the town of Kafr Amma with heavy artillery, killing a civilian and wounding a child in Kafr Amma. On 23 September 2022, regime forces targeted a civilian vehicle in the town of Tadil with a guided missile, injuring two children. In the northern countryside of Idleb, on 27 September 2022, Russian warplanes conducted several air strikes around the city of Sarmada, targeting IDPs camps. The bombardment destroyed a hospital and a school and injured eight civilians. There was also widespread panic among the IDPs in the camp, some of whom fled to nearby farms. Schools were suspended, and children returned to their homes amid great fear. In the western countryside of Idleb, On 30 September 2022, Russian warplanes bombarded the towns of Mseibin and Ruweiha with 12 air strikes.

In the northern countryside of Aleppo, on 22 September 2022, a motorcycle bomb exploded in the city of Raju, injuring three civilians, including a child. On 25 September 2022, several artillery shells landed in the city of Afrin, targeting two kindergartens in the Kuwait Ar-Rahmah camp without causing any casualties. Information sources confirm that the sources of the shells are areas under the control of the regime forces and the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF).

Northeast Syria



In eastern Syria, on 22 September 2022, teachers carried out a general strike in several educational complexes in Deir ez-Zor and Al-Hasakah governorates to adjust monthly salaries and link them to the US Dollar commensurate with the living situation and the high prices of materials. Notably, the Autonomous Administration of the so-called Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) continues to distribute salaries in Syrian pounds in light of the deterioration of their exchange rates against the US dollar. They called on the Education Authority to issue an immediate decision to stop the distribution of the new curriculum in Deir ez-Zor Governorate so that students could attend their schools. Most parents refused to send their children to schools due to the SDF's imposition of educational curricula that parents do not desire. Teachers also called on UNICEF to intervene to prevent SDF from attempting to change curricula, as schools in Deir ez-Zor Governorate have adopted the UNICEF accelerated curriculum during the past years. Clan elders, headed by the Sheikh of Al-Baggara Clan, Hajim Al-Bashir, issued a statement rejecting the teaching curricula imposed by SDF.

In the northern countryside of Al-Hasakeh on 22 September 2022, the so-called Syrian democratic forces (SDF) announced that they had thwarted a major plan for ISIS sleeper cells to attack Al Hol camp by preparing two car bombs. The cell was ambushed near the village of Um Fakik and clashed with it. As a result of the clash, the cell detonated one of the two car bombs. Three of the cell's members were killed, and one was injured. The second car was dismantled, and a tank with explosive materials weighing approximately 300 kg was found.

In eastern Deir ez-Zor, on 22 September 2022, SDF, with the support of the aviation of the international coalition, carried out a campaign of arrests in the towns of Zir and Kassar. The campaign resulted in the arrest of several young men after violent clashes between the two parties. International coalition helicopters dropped flare bombs in the desert of the town of Rweished in the early hours without knowing why.
