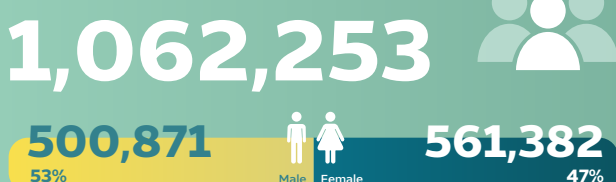


IDP's Camps Monitoring Study

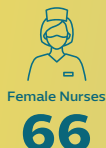
